The summer term began with exam season with pupils in Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 all working towards **external examinations**. Countless revision study sessions were put on by departments and pupils managed the time well. Since exam season ended, school life has been vibrant. The term has ended with **fun and engaging learning**. Key Stage Three had **Science, PE and Language festivals**. The Languages Department workshops included clog dancing, Welsh Cake Making, a Cardiff Bay treasure hunt and **triple literacy lessons** examining European language similarities and the **celebration of all languages** spoken in school.

Duke of Edinburgh pupils had numerous **expeditions** this term with record numbers achieving awards. The whole school has been active with **sports days** and **house competitions**. Trips have included **Geography field trips**, a theatre trip to **Stratford** and **Technocamp** where the **Archcoders** took second place in a live challenge. There was a further visit to **Wellington College** with Year 11 to strengthen our partnership working and get ready for university applications whilst chemists took part in laboratory working at **Swansea University**. This year, more pupils than ever before will attend study days or weeks in prestigious universities. The school welcomed **Sir David Ramsden**, Deputy Governor of the Bank of England, as our guest speaker with pupils getting insight into the financial world.

The **Festival of Learning** was fully embraced. The Learners' day, hosted by our pupils, showcased presentations on **Visible Learning** and the **Lead Creative Schools programme**. The school won prizes for the logo design and the **Archcellists** took centre stage. At our summer concert our musicians shone in the **Going Solomble** concert and the **Eisteddfod 2018** was a fantastic celebration of performance and **Welsh culture**.

Wonderful primary cluster working and transition days culminated in our **Welcome Mass**. Charity work remains vibrant. Fundraising has taken place for **Noah's Ark**, the **Barnardo's Big Toddle**,

Héronsbridge School, Bridgend Samaritans and Oshi's World. The **First Give workshops** focused on fundraising and raising awareness for various charities whilst pupils harnessed presentation skills and social action ideas. Sixth Formers also ran the **Y Bont afternoon tea**. In the last three weeks over **£3000** has been raised.

Pupils still achieve huge amounts outside of school. To name a few: **Ioan Davis** took silver in the British Schools Judo Championships; **Esmee Davies** and **Isobella Renn** beat 40 couples in a national dance competition; whilst **Xander Payne** won his Welsh vest for basketball and **Ffion Higginson** gained further Welsh honours for athletics. Music remains vibrant. Many pupils represent the Four Counties and Bridgend Music Service Orchestras and **Abbie Linforth** and **Samuel Finch** are part of the National Youth Orchestra for Wales.

This term is always one of change and there are exciting times ahead with the appointment of five **Heads of House** to strengthen the **Progress and Wellbeing** team in the school. The school says goodbye to some departing staff. Please remember in your prayers **Mr John Barry, Mrs Ursula McPhee, Miss Stephanie Robinson, Mrs Angela Townsend** and **Mrs Julie Stoddart** as they depart our school. We wish them the very best and thank them for many years dedicated service to our school community.
